Human Excellence Scholarship

Background

1. Wah Yan College, Kowloon is a Jesuit school and our Jesuit education aims to nurture human excellence, our students being groomed to embody qualities of competence, commitment, compassion and conscience. They grow up to be “Men for and with Others” and aspire to be leaders-in-service.
2. We serve the faith that does justice and we embrace students who come from underprivileged families. Students have equal opportunities to receive quality education, and this Scholarship aims to (1) invite financially needy students with high potential to apply to study at Wah Yan; and (2) encourage students to further develop their God-given talent for the greater glory of God.

Eligibility

3. The Scholarship is open to financially needy applicants of the F.1 Discretionary Place Application for Wah Yan College, Kowloon. The eligible applicants are supported by either Comprehensive Social Security Assistance (CSSA) Scheme or other subsidies such as textbook allowance or waiver to sustain their studies.

Selection Criteria

4. We look for students with high potential in the academic area, sports, music, service and other areas. Students’ performance in the application interview would also be considered.

Award Details

5. Each year, three students with the highest potential will be selected and awarded. The awarded students will receive the Scholarship of HK\$10,000.
6. The Scholarship granted would be renewable annually throughout the 6-year secondary education, in the light of academic progress and other performance deemed outstanding. Each cohort of application amounts to HK\$10,000 x 3 x 6, totally HK\$ 180,000.

Application, Selection and Announcement of Results

7. Once admitted to Wah Yan, financially needy students with high potential may apply for the scholarship. The school will review their application information and also consider their performance in the application interview.
8. The awardees of the Scholarship will be notified of the result individually.

Other Conditions

9. If no awardees could be identified, the scholarship would be vacated until the next cohort of application.
