Dear educators, parents and Wahyanites,

Take Care, Keep Calm, Stay Healthy

It has been 57 days since face-to-face classes were suspended again on 2 December 2020, amid a surge in COVID-19 infections. How are you? The vast and green campus at 56 Waterloo Road looks bleak and desolate without your presence; every day only one sixth of the total number of students may come back, making the campus just a shadow of itself, without your joyous smiles and youthful exuberance.

Having fought the pandemic blues for over a year's time, we have stretched ourselves to the limit. Much as we long for a placid life, we are still constantly dazzled, if not churned up, by different challenges. The recent lockdowns for mandatory testing for COVID-19, first in the Jordan area and next the Yau Ma Tei area, both in our neighbourhood, have probably taken most residents there by surprise. Some of you live in those areas and you must have been experiencing deep hardship. I empathize with you, and so do our alumni. In addition to the usual financial and emotional support, alumni of Class '67 and I have worked together to set up a one-off scholarship, Professor James Tong Scholarship, for offering financial assistance to Wahyanites who show resilience in adversity despite family financial difficulties due to the pandemic. You are welcome to apply for the scholarship via class teachers.

Since our inception in 1924, Wah Yan College, Kowloon has been standing strong on our home turf for almost a century, caring, nurturing, and accompanying generations of Wahyanites who grow up in the same neighborhood through thick and thin. At this particularly difficult moment, we want to accompany you and your families through this trying year with staunch support that you can always rely on; one day you can also be men for and with others, helping the needy ones at large. At Wah Yan, we care and we stand by you; Emmanuel, God is with us.

Diseases, like fake news and rumours, are everywhere and amid a fast-changing and volatile situation, we have to keep calm and stay positive as every cloud has a silver lining. Don't panic! What seems to be a threat may turn out to be a blessing in disguise, just like our big leap in self-directed learning and eLearning, thanks to online learning due to the suspension of face-to-face classes.



Throughout the challenging times, we have also learnt gratitude, companionship and resilience.
