Arrangements for Face-to-Face Class Resumption (Whole-School, Half-Day) from 24 May 2021 Onwards

As we embrace the Ignatian Year, which commences on 20 May 2021, face-to-face class resumption for the whole school is, coincidentally, made possible at the same time – even though the academic year is, yet again, drawing to a close. Still, we consider it a glimmer of blessings in the wake of the lingering pandemic.

Pursuant to the latest circular released by the Education Bureau (EDB), with effect from 24 May 2021, face-to-face classes could be arranged for the whole school on a half-day basis. The 7-lesson eLearning timetable will be used up to 21 May 2021, but for 24 – 28 May 2021, the 9-lesson half-day timetable will be adopted as all the forms, S.1 to S.5, will come back to have face-to-face classes on campus:

basis. On 31 May 2021, there will be a whole-day Staff Development Day for teachers to keep abreast of the latest development in education; students will have a day off to prepare for the Final Examination commencing on 1 June 2021.
